



A Life Well Lived- Remembering George Sable Rebecca Sr., Class of 1967

We are saddened to share the passing of George Sable Rebecca Sr. Dr. George Rebecca age 73, of Killeen, Texas passed away on July 12, 2022. He was born on January 21, 1949. A native of Pennsauken, New Jersey, George attended Bishop Eustace and graduated with the class of 1967. He was president of the student council his senior year.

George did his undergraduate studies at the University of Notre Dame, graduating in 1971. He loved the Army ROTC at ND (in which he was top cadet). He went on to Georgetown University Medical School and had a cardiology fellowship from Harvard.

He was a career Army medical officer and paratrooper in the 82old airborne division. He retired with the rank of full Colonel.

Upon retirement from the military, George started his own cardiology practice in Killeen, Texas. He was loved by his patients, staff and fellow doctors. "Dr. Rebecca was by far the most compassionate and caring man that I, and I'm positive, many others, have personally encountered. He wore his heart on his sleeve, and would personally see that his peers, loved ones, and especially his patients were taken care of " – Jacob Wong, US Marine.
