

BISHOP EUSTACE PREPARATORY SCHOOL

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SCHOOL COMMUNITY

Bishop Eustace Preparatory School is a Catholic co-educational, private high school located in Pennsauken, New Jersey. The Pallottine Fathers and Brothers established Bishop Eustace in 1954. Bishop Eustace began as a school for young men and in 1972 admitted young women. Since its first graduating class in 1958, over 97% of Bishop Eustace graduates have continued their education in college.

MISSION STATEMENT

Within the Catholic tradition, Bishop Eustace Preparatory School - a private four-year coeducational academic environment - promotes the lived philosophy of St. Vincent Pallotti, the founder of the Pallottines. The mission of the school, through the collaboration of clergy, religious, and laity, is to prepare all students to realize their unique potential through spiritual growth, Christian service, education, and personal development. By fostering selfdiscipline, integrity, cooperation, and responsibility among our young men and women, Bishop Eustace ensures that students will become productive citizens in a diverse, challenging, and evolving world. Bishop Eustace is one of the best private Catholic schools in New Jersey.

ACADEMIC PROCEDURES

The school day consists of eight forty-minute class periods. Classes are held Monday through Friday on a six-day cycle. The school year is comprised of two semesters with two quarterly marking periods within each semester. Examinations are administered at the end of each semester. In calculating the semester grade, the two quarter grades are weighted at forty percent each while the examination grade is weighted at twenty percent of the semester grade. Final grades are posted on the transcript at the end of each school year. For seniors, a first-semester grade report is generated and forwarded to the colleges and universities to which each student has applied. As a matter of policy, Bishop Eustace does not report information regarding a student's disciplinary records to third parties. Bishop Eustace does not rank students. Official transcripts will be sent to college admissions offices through Naviance which uses the Docufide System.

PROGRAM OF STUDY

The program of study at Bishop Eustace prepares students for post-secondary success. While students are required to meet the minimum requirements for graduation, it is strongly recommended students complete 4 years of all core academic classes (Math, English, are calculated by multiplying the point Science, and History), with at least 3 years of a World Language, to remain competitive for college admissions. Every student who graduates will have:

GRADE POINT AVERAGES

Cumulative GPAs are computed for work completed at Bishop Eustace only. The average is computed by dividing the total number of quality points earned by the total number of credits earned. Quality points equivalent by the credits earned per course. All subjects are considered when computing the GPA.
