- Read *Fahrenheit 451* by Ray Bradbury
 - There will be a test the first week of school.
- Read 1 of the following novels and create a piece of art that combines similar elements of both the novel and *Fahrenheit 451*(see directions below). We will be presenting our art pieces the first week of school.
 - *The Hunger Games* (*Hunger Games*, *Catching Fire*, *Mockingjay*, *The Ballad of Songbirds and Snakes*) by Suzanne Collins
 - *Divergent* (series) by Veronica Roth
 - *The Selection* (series) by Kiera Cass
 - *The Uglies* (series) by Scott Westerfeld
 - *Scythe* (series) by Neal Shusterman
 - *Ready Player 1* (series) by Ernest Cline
 - *The Maze Runner* (series) by James Dashner
 - *Matched* (series) by Allie Condie
- **Art Project Directions:**
 - As you read the novels, take notes on characters, plot, theme, conflicts, setting as psychology, symbols, and anything else you notice or see as important.
 - After you finish reading, create an art image that highlights at least 1 element of the novels (conflicts, symbols, themes, etc) that is similar. You are working on developing the skill of identifying intertextuality. **You must bring your creation and your printed paragraph to class on the first day of school.**
 - You can create a physical poster, collage, drawing, painting, shadow box, sculpture, or another art form; you can also create something digitally, however, you must print it and bring it to school the first day.
 - Be creative.
 - Your first and last name and school year should be included somewhere on your creation (front, back, etc).
 - Analyze your creation and how it connects to both novels in 1 paragraph typed in MLA format.
 - Questions to consider (you do not need to answer these – they are to help you brainstorm):
 - Are there any symbols within your image?
 - Did you use certain colors or textures to highlight emotions or conflicts?
 - How does *Fahrenheit 451* relate to your novel? In what ways are the worlds similar or different? How did you show this in your creation?
